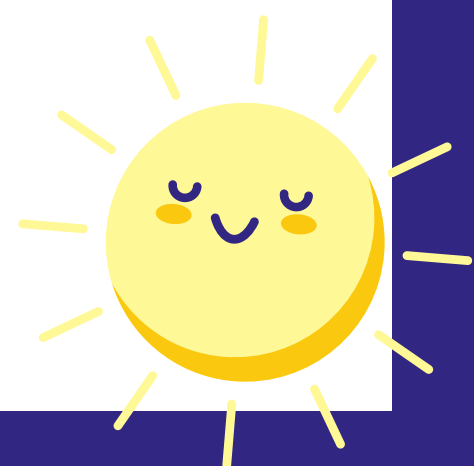
It has been a busy and exciting year across Embrace schools and one which has enabled us to grow and develop how we all work together collaboratively, strengthening all that we do.

We are so proud of our staff and all they have achieved this year, here are just a few:



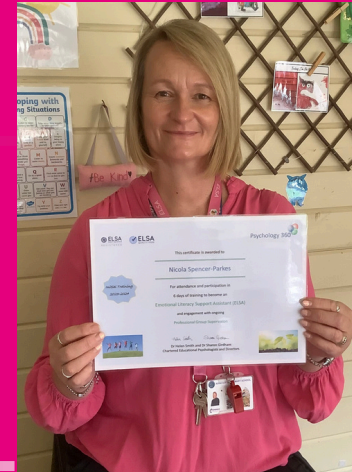
Laura McWhinnie, Embrace Director of Education, achieved a Level 7 Coaching qualification.

Nikki Spencer-Parks, Teaching Assistant at Arnesby, achieved an ELSA qualification.

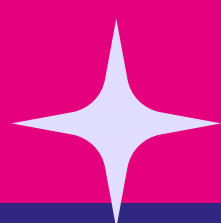


Sue Lawrence, Assistant Principal and SENCo, is retiring this year after 41 years at Brockington.

Huncote

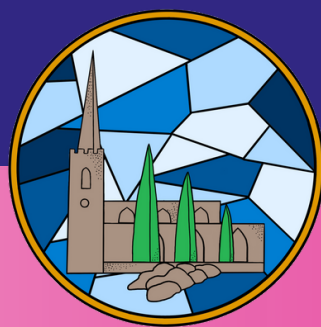
We recently had a very exciting and informative assembly from the Air Ambulance!

The students have shown great skill and talent and are working hard. Stay tuned to see the finished mural!

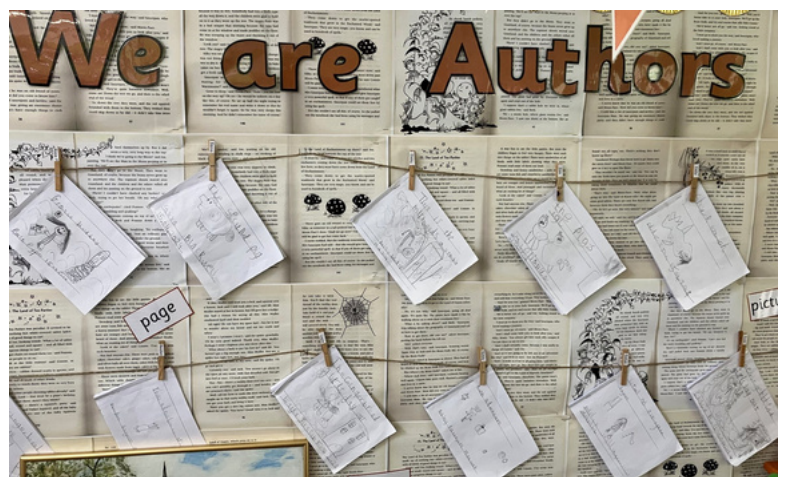




Sherrier

The approach has been a great success so far, and pupils have enjoyed using their Personal Writing Journals!

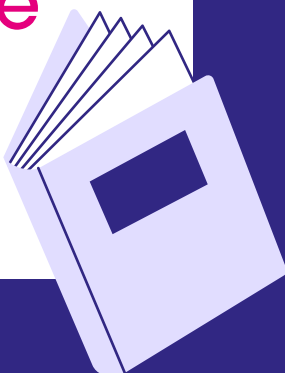


St Peter's Whetstone

Sex Education Forum

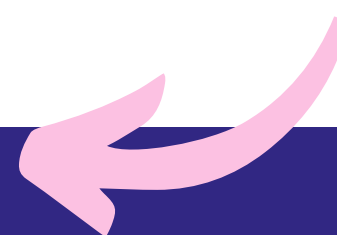
