As the summer term approaches, along with exams and next steps, it is important to remember to take the time to rest too and, with this in mind, I would like to wish you all a good Easter break.

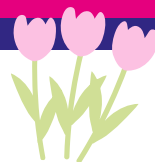
Spotlight

Find out more Year 6 Online Safety Project

The Police and Crime Commissioner for Leicester, Leicestershire, and Rutland has launched an innovative Virtual Reality project called "First Phone: Keeping Children Safe Online." This initiative offers a fantastic opportunity for our pupils to learn about online safety through immersive VR experiences.

Developed in collaboration with the Violence Reduction Network (VRN) and other partners, the project includes a six-minute VR film and a comprehensive educational program aligned with the PSHE curriculum. The film and accompanying sessions help children understand the risks of social media, cyberbullying, and the impact of algorithms, while encouraging open communication with parents and caregivers.

We are thrilled to roll out this project with our Year 6 children, providing them with an engaging and impactful way to stay safe online.
